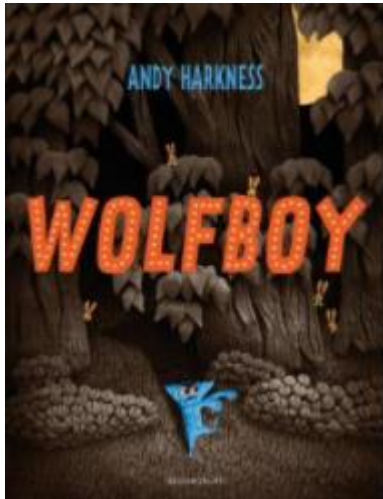

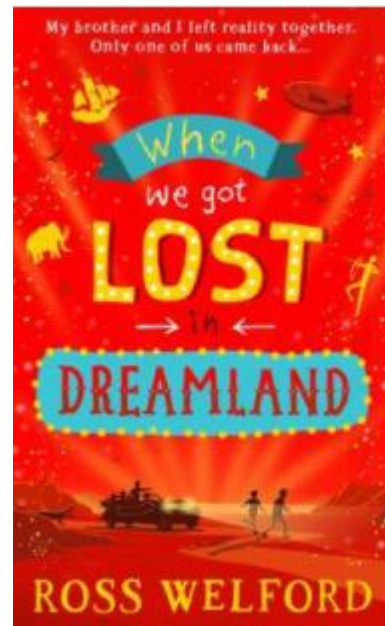

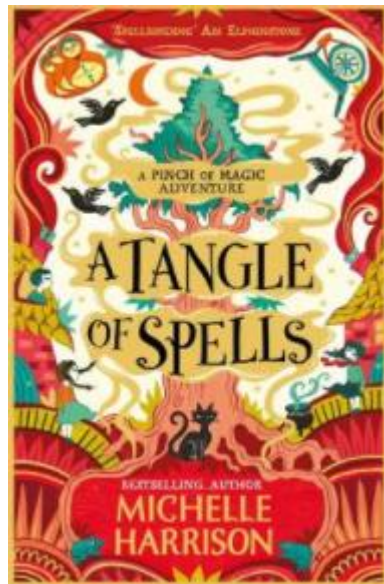
Mrs Stephens's recommended reads....
