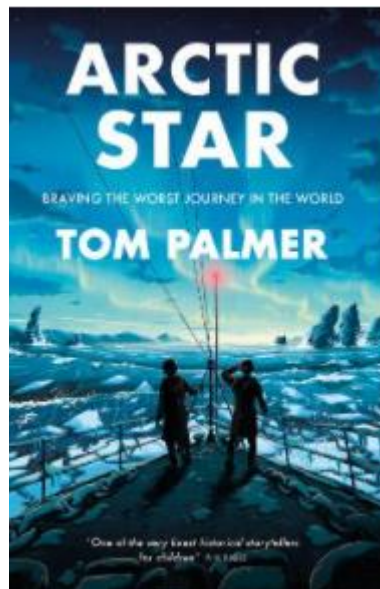
Mrs Stephens's recommended reads....



Early years: This book has a positively playful look at self-expression. Fred is the main character, and whilst appearing naked, always has his modesty preserved. Throughout the book he hopes to find an outfit that suits him. By the end mum, dad and dog have joined him to show him how to do it properly. Such a lovely book to show positivity, love, acceptance and support!



KS1 – Who hasn't struggled with something new? That's life and learning how to 'let go' and celebrate the freedom and success is what this book is all about. The illustrations are beautiful and help to exemplify the moments of exhilaration



Lower Key Stage 2 – Tom Palmer is one of my favourite authors, tackling stories around world war fiction. This one is based around a naval adventure, where he worked with the Imperial War museum to retell this thrilling story. It has many references to relief events but tailored them to suit this age group.



Upper Key Stage 2 – This book is the debut from the author, Francesca Gibbons. The main character, Imogen, has a challenging home life and so follows the strange, silver moth – leading her through a door in a tree. See what happens to her and her sister, Marie, in this magical world. Does she get back to her normal life? Who do they meet?
