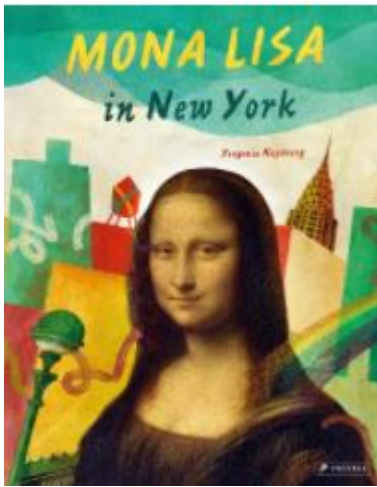

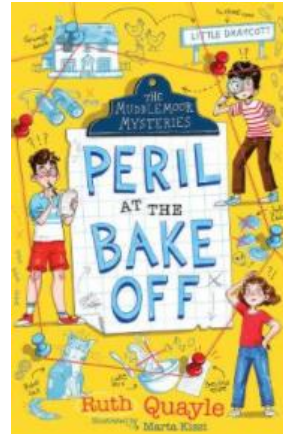

Mrs Stephens's recommended reads....



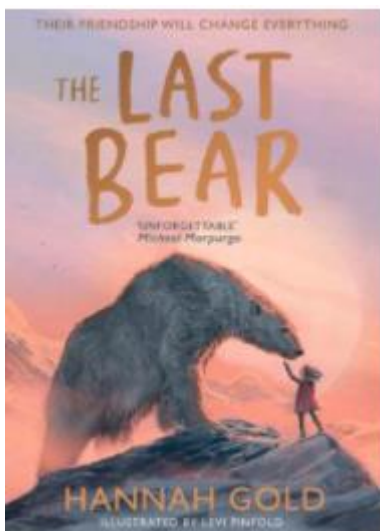
Key Stage 1: Take a trip around New York, with Mona Lisa and Tag. They visit many iconic places including the Bronx and Harlem.
