News

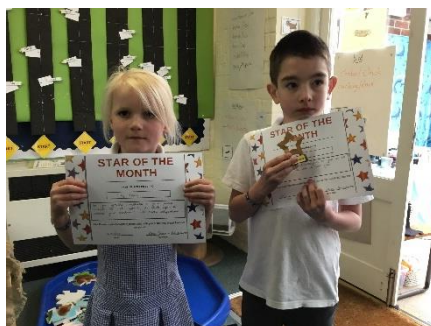

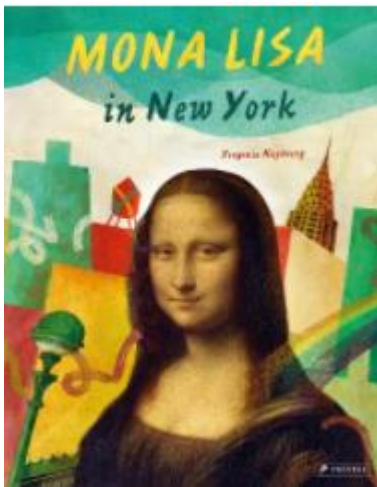

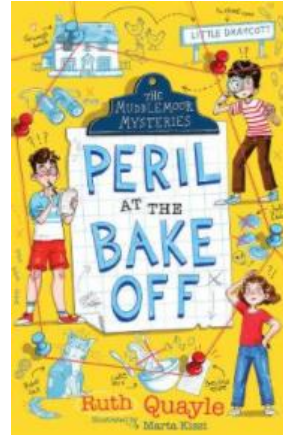
